

About LA vs Hate

LA vs Hate is a community-centered system designed to support all residents and communities targeted for hate acts of all kinds in Los Angeles County. Led by the LA County Commission on Human Relations, LA vs Hate partners with community partners from all five County districts, representing a diverse coalition of voices committed to prevent and respond to hate.

The goals of the LA vs Hate System are:

- Address the normalization of hate and inspire people to stand up to it
- Build understanding about what constitutes a hate act and how to report it
- Support individuals and communities as they heal from the trauma of hate

By tracking and reporting hate we can ensure that resources are allocated appropriately, that those targeted by hate receive the support they need, and that together, we can build respectful and resilient communities. If you or someone you know has been the victim of hate, please report the incident by calling 2-1-1.

LA vs Hate uses a variety of strategies in its prevention and response work including art, healing interventions, bystander training, outreach and training for law enforcement, public school resourcing, and a pilot program for small businesses impacted by hate.

About the Commission on Human Relations

The Los Angeles County Commission on Human Relations is dedicated to promoting positive human relations in an increasingly complex and multicultural county. The Commission works to develop programs that proactively address racism, sexism, homophobia, religious prejudice, linguistic bias, anti-immigrant sentiment, and other divisive attitudes that can lead to intercultural tension, hate crimes, human rights violations, and related violence.

About 211

Contacting 211 LA is free, confidential, and accessible in 140 languages. 211 LA is a public non-profit (501C-3) organization that contracts with the County of Los Angeles to provide county-wide Information and referral services, and delivers case management resources to victims of hate. 211 works with victims of hate who are in fear of reporting to law enforcement by encouraging these victims to report to law enforcement, although victims are assured their report can be anonymous.
